WHO WILL BENEFIT:

The AAHA Helping Pets Fund provides grants for veterinary treatment of sick and injured pets in need. Grants are available through AAHA-accredited veterinary practices in the United States and Canada.

The Fund was launched April 1, 2005. To date, more than 3,000 pets have been helped through grants totaling nearly \$1 million. The Fund relies solely on donor support to provide these grants.
